



Please find below the brief note on the campaign by UNEP and CEE, in which the Harish Bhat Pakshi Vana has been featured.

The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) approached the Centre for Environment Education (CEE) for the celebration of World Environment Day on 5th June, 2021 at National Level in India. The theme for this year is 'Ecosystem Restoration', and this day also marks the formal launch of the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration 2021-2030. This drive highlights the efforts and provides opportunities to turn the tide to prevent, halt and reverse the degradation of ecosystems like agricultural areas, grasslands, mountains, wetlands, protected wildlife reserves, managed plantations, lakes, rivers, coastal areas etc., worldwide.

The decade activities are led by the UNEP, FAO and partners (IUCN, CBD, UNCCD, UNESCO, UNECE and UNFCCC) which covers terrestrial as well as coastal and marine ecosystems. The tangible benefits of the Decade can be viewed through the lens of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) such as substantial Nature-based solutions for climate change mitigation and adaptation, water and food security, poverty reduction, economic growth and biodiversity conservation.

Ecosystem restoration theme refers to taking action for repairing ecosystems that have been degraded as well as protecting the ones that are healthy. Education and communication plays a critical role in reaching out to various target groups to inform and involve them in taking appropriate action for ecosystem preservation.

On this note, CEE and UNEP has launched a 6 month Information-Education-Communication campaign called 'Act To Restore', involving young students and teachers, other stakeholders like individuals, NGOs, young professionals, youth organisations, communities, journalists, corporates, etc, across India. Each month highlights a specific ecosystem as mentioned below,

June - Oceans and Coasts July - Forest Ecosystems August - Freshwater September - Farmlands & Grasslands October - Mountains November - Urban Areas

With the above said themes for the respective months, a poster was released with certain information, action plans and case studies across the country. The attached poster was released for the month of July for the Forest Ecosystem theme. Various case studies were taken from across the country to be added on this poster. After a review, the Harish Bhat Pakshi Vana at Alva's Institute of Engineering and Technology was selected and added in the poster for circulation amongst all stakeholders of this campaign.
